City skies light up as cathedral turns 100

THOUSANDS of people saw Liverpool Cathedral lit up with fireworks in an amazing climax to a weekend of centenary celebrations.

The extravaganza was held ahead of today's official centenary service.

Prince Edward, the Earl of Wessex, was leading the service with the Bishop of Liverpool, the Right Reverend James Jones, at 4pm - exactly 100 years since King Edward VII laid the building's foundation stone.

More than 2,000 people will attend the event, including 400 descendants of those who helped design and build the cathedral on St James Mount.

The cathedral later played host to a celebration of performing arts.

The neo-Gothic cathedral is the fifth largest in the world.

The foundation stone was laid at 4pm on July 19, 1904, but the building was not completed until 74 years later. It was opened by the Queen on October 25, 1978.
